For Frieze Seoul 2026, Meyer Riegger Wolff brings together works by Marcel Duchamp, Miriam Cahn, Katinka Bock, Jeewi Lee and Jioong Kang. Spanning nearly a century of artistic practice, the presentation explores how artists working across different generations continue to question perception, the transformative potential of materials, and the shifting relationship between image and object.

At the heart of the presentation is Marcel Duchamp's *Rotoreliefs* (1953), a landmark work in the history of twentieth-century art that transforms simple printed discs into moving optical events through rotation. Conceived as an experiment in perception rather than representation, the work extends Duchamp's lifelong investigation into vision, movement and the active role of the viewer. Its presentation at Frieze Seoul coincides with *Marcel Duchamp: A Parisian Collection*, on view at Meyer Riegger Wolff Seoul from 27 August to 5 November 2026, placing the work in dialogue with a major exhibition dedicated to one of the twentieth century's most influential artistic figures.

While each artist pursues a distinct practice, unexpected correspondences emerge in the ways perception, material transformation, and the relationship between image and object unfold across their works. Katinka Bock's sculptures reconsider familiar forms through subtle shifts of balance, function and scale, allowing ceramic, bronze and found elements to acquire unexpected poetic resonance. Miriam Cahn's recent paintings transform everyday domestic motifs into psychologically charged images in which intimacy and unease quietly coexist. Jeewi Lee's *Silent flame* series explores the material qualities of hanji and tree resin, creating luminous surfaces through processes of layering, translucency and accumulation. Jioong Kang's works similarly investigate the photographic image through processes of transfer, layering and sedimentation, combining photography with textile, leather and tidal mud sediment to create layered compositions in which images remain in a continual state of transformation.

Across painting, sculpture, installation and photography, the presentation brings together five distinct artistic practices while allowing each work to retain its own autonomy. The resulting encounter reveals unexpected affinities across generations, opening new ways of thinking about materiality and the evolving relationship between image and object.
