
Elodie Seguin

«The missing Thing»





For her fifth solo exhibition at the Galerie Jocelyn Wolff, Elodie Seguin stages a dialogue between order and disorder in "The Missing Thing," a circuit built through a succession of original pieces which call unity and production into question.

After three years of research and two residencies on the subject of transparency, she proposes to think of thermoforming as a sculpture gesture. A gesture that also gives form to an absence and importance to everything that we do not see.
