For our participation in this 10th edition of West Bund Art & Design, we are planning to show a selection of paintings and drawings by Miriam Cahn, Santiago de Paoli and Prinz Gholam, in dialogue with sculptures by Isa Melsheimer, Francisco Tropa, and Katinka Bock.

Some historical works, such as series of drawings from the 80s and 90s by Miriam Cahn, will interact with more recent pieces by Santiago de Paoli and Prinz Gholam. While during the previous editions of the fair, Santiago de Paoli's work was introduced mainly in the form of oil on felt fabric, this time a new masterpiece on copper will be presented. Titled *Butterfly & worm, you are open, Autumn unfolds'*, this De Paoli's piece is part of a very new series of works and it is directly coming from the artist's studio to West Bund.

Prinz Gholam mark the transition between painting, drawing and sculpture in our booth. Recently participating in different projects around China, on the occasion of Aranya Plein Air Art Festival, this artists duo produced some new 'Chinese' pieces, made of local stones elements from Jinshanling area. '*Stone Faces (Jin Shan Ling), Tea Table'* (2023) will be exhibited along with a few drawings from the series '*Similitude*' (2018). These pastel figurative pieces are named after several mythological entities but represented with human figures in modern costumes, as a reflection on the topic of 'dancing on my own' and glamourous balls in the context of historical sites and the hedonist atmosphere.

If `Shanghai publics' could discover Isa Melsheimer's gouaches and textiles pieces in the previous editions of the fair, this time a few glazed ceramics will be displayed. From textile to ceramic, from gouache painting to embroidery, Melsheimer's exploration of forms and monochrome paintings are echoing with each other in the booth space.

To develop this sculptural research on forms, Francisco Tropa proposes a 'spatial game' through the artwork '*Antipode'* (2015), where the brass and wooden cylinders can be assembled or disassembled in different configurations. On the other hand, '*Terrace'* (2017) and '*Gradiva'* (2017-2020) engage the visitors into Tropa's long-term study on anthropology and his imagined pre-history events. Those two works, part of the same series, are using inorganic materials as 'unearthed' artifices of a lost civilisation.


Differently exhibited from the sculptures 'Parasite Fountain' (2013) at Aranya Plein Air Art Festival in Jinshanling and from '*Passerelle*' (2023) at Jing'an sculpture Park in Shanghai, Katinka Bock's work will be represented by a spoon-shaped sculpture '*Cuillère Couchée (suspendue/debout')* (2022). This big oak spoon embodies the reoccurring theme in Bock's practice of 'unusable object', which can also be observed in some of her other works like '*Parasite Fountain'*, where 'bad casting' looks like the result of the 'cremation process' casting. This contradiction is a consequence of the impractical scale or materials of those pieces. Bock is exploring the (dis)usage of objects on an ontological level, hence to question the human's interference. Exhibited Artists:







Prinz Gholam Similitude (Bras Noir) 2018 PGH/D 53 coloured pencil on paper 122 x 86 cm




